Program to Organize City's Youths

Sylvie Vidrine, 17, will strive this summer to bring Burlington teen-agers closer to their neighborhoods, their schools and their city.

"If they get a better attitude, and feel they are more a part of the community, they will feel like they belong," she said. "There will be less delinquency."

She and Greg Gover, 17, will work with Peter Corbett, recently hired by the King Street Area Youth Program to organize the city's teens.

The program, funded by a 13,594 grant from the Vermont Commission on the Administration of Justice, is similar to one the King Street organization has had for neighborhood groups, said Michael Monte.

Monte, director of the King Street program, said Corbett will go into the city's neighborhoods to find teens and try to bring them into existing neighborhood groups.

Youths now rarely participate in such organizations, Monte said. Miss Vidrine, a Burlington High School senior, and Gover, a

1981 Burlington High graduate, will work 25 hours a week, each at minimum wage. The program begins July 1.

Monte said the project will work with, but be separate from, Mayor Bernard Sanders' Youth Council and youth desk.
